Making Introductions Properly

Setting Your Cats Up for Success

Proper introductions are key to forming good relationships between your cats, preventing fights, and decreasing stress.

When you bring a rescue home from the BVSPCA, keep in mind that we don't always know their backgrounds or histories

How to Make Proper Introductions:

- Separate your new cat into a room, while letting your other cat retain access to the rest of the home. Allow the cats to smell and paw-touch under the **closed** door.
- After a couple days, allow the new cat to explore the home while your other cat is in a separate room.
- Gradually move feeding bowls closer to the separating door. Transfer sleeping blankets from each cat into one another's living space.
- After a week, allow the cats to meet.
 They may hiss/growl to establish hierarchy. This is ok. If they fight, calmly return them to their spaces.
- Set up equal access to vertical spaces, hiding areas, food, water, litter and toys in the home.

A Few Other Tips:

- Either cat may hide or avoid each other. Give them time to gain confidence. Do not force an introduction between the cats.
- Do not leave pets together unsupervised until they have fully accepted each other and you are certain they are safe. This may take weeks or months. It will take TIME.
- Some pets become companions, while others simply tolerate each other. The ability of pets to get along depends on their individual personalities.
